Since the last newsletter, we have completed two trips. In early June, 47 members travelled to Reims for, what was before Covid, our annual Champagne Tour. Our 6 day trip went without a hitch and we even managed to get a slightly earlier Eurotunnel out and back home. We visited a number of first class vineyards, some known to us and several new ones. Whilst in the region, we also took time out for a river cruise with lunch (and drink) on the Marne and found some good restaurants to eat between visits to the vineyards.

Our second trip was to Worcestershire for the 5 night/6 day Mystery trip. Shortly before the trip, the destination was released to members. It was to the 4* Stanbrook Abbey Hotel which, in an earlier life was home to a large number of nuns and still retains the atmosphere in the beautiful cloisters and Chapel. The hotel and food was fabulous and staff excellent. During our time in Worcestershire our itinerary was both interesting and varied. We had lunch on the way to Worcester at a cider farm where we sampled many perry's and cider's and finished with a Ploughman's lunch. On our first evening, we had a Champagne reception with bottles purchased in France during our trip in June. During our trip, we visited such places as Forgehill Needle Museum, Morgan Car Company, Malvern Abbey, Avoncroft Rural Museum and expert collector's talk at Royal Worcester Porcelain. At each venue tours were arranged and our guides were very knowledgeable. Considering that this trip included the tours mentioned above with all hotel meals and some lunches, not to mention the free champagne, it was excellent value for well less than £900pp.

We continue to have excellent support from members for the day trips in and around London. In July on a warm sunny day members joined a Blue Badge guide for a circular walk starting at St Paul's underground station and finishing at St Paul's Cathedral. Along the way we took in stories of bombing and bravery during the Blitz of 1940/41, life in the underground shelters and the night St Paul's burned. The story of how the City came through the destruction to rise like a phoenix from the flames told by people who lived through it and extracts from the diary of an 18 year old boy. Our next day trip in October is to Vintners' Hall, with its origins steeped in the history of the City of London and the import, regulation and sale of wine; it continues to maintain strong links with the wine trade known as the "spiritual home of the international wine trade". And much more: with its current trade, social, charitable and educational interests, it continues to play an important role in the 21st century.
